Development Update

Doohan Reserve - Building works to both clubhouses have now been completed, turf has been placed on both fields and both cricket pitches have been installed. Cricket nets are also complete, including fencing,



shelter and retaining walls along with the multi-purpose courts with the final layer of asphalt recently laid.

All light poles have been installed and are operational. Soft landscaping and planting is well underway to the entire reserve.

Works are in progress to the substructure and drainage of the tennis courts and the all abilities playground and the focus for the coming months will be completion of these works and concrete works to the playground.

Dawson Park / Splash Park - Great news! The park will be opening to public on 4 December. Unfortunately due to current restrictions, we are unable to hold a community event as previously planned, however residents will soon be able to enjoy these fantastic facilities. Please note that Camden Council have advised that the opening of the water play spaces is on a trial basis and they ask that everyone signs-in at the venue using the QR code provided at the Additionally, park users entrance. are asked to please follow the latest social distancing guidelines.

The splash park area of the park has 30 water features that form part of

this amazing water play space. In addition the park offers a junior and youth play space, including a half basketball court and Ninja Warrior course. Exercise equipment, amenities block, BBQ's and shelters are also provided.

Dawson-Damer Park is a wonderful addition to our open space and we're excited to finally be able to share this space with our residents.

Did you know? Dawson-Damer Park is named after prominent motor racing identity John Dawson-Damer, or 'DD' as he liked to be known. Born in the UK in 1941, he moved to Australia in 1964 where he soon Austral family's ioined his Engineering Supplies business. He was a fine engineer, but having raced historic cars for around 15 years, he was also a respected authority on historic racing and was Chairman of the Australian ruling body, CAM's Historic Commission, for 20 years. He and his wife Ashley purchased Oran Park House (now known as Catherine Park House), they undertook where major restorations to the homestead as well as adding a sizeable garage to house his internationally renowned Lotus car collection.







Tragically John Dawson-Damer was killed in 2000 when he lost control of his Lotus 63 as he crossed the finishing line at the Goodwood Festival in the UK.

Oran Park Tavern - all approvals have now been received and construction works are expected to commence in December.

Service station - EG, the service station operator, lodged a DA with Camden Council in August and they are awaiting approval. The service station will be located on the corner of Oran Park and Peter Brock Drives.

Employment Zone - Bulk earthworks are underway on Stage 1 of the Employment Zone on the corner of Dick Johnson Drive and The Northern Road.

Roads

Connection to Springfield Road - Greenfields Development Company have completed works on the road connection from Peter Brock Drive to Springfield Road.

This road will provide another connection for Oran Park Town and will benefit residents travelling via Camden Valley Way.

With Oran Park Drive getting busier, GDC recognised the importance of providing another connection to Camden Valley Way, in advance of the future Catherine Fields precinct being redeveloped. With this in mind, GDC purchased the adjoining land bordering Oran Park Town to enable a private road to be constructed, connecting Peter Brock Drive to Springfield Road.

To complete this connection, Camden Council have programmed upgrade works to be undertaken in Springfield Road from 23 November to 28 November 2020, with linemarking to be completed by 4 December, subject to weather conditions. The new road is



expected to be opened on Saturday 5 December.

In addition, Hollows Drive which connects Oran Park Town with the Catherine Park development is now open. This will provide residents with an alternate access to St Justin's Primary School and St Benedict's Catholic College.

is that it's delivered flexibly and right here in the centre of Oran Park, which means that hands-on skills can be learnt in the comfort of our own community.

The Smart Work Hub offers south west Sydney residents the opportunity to work in a professional co-working space without the commute to their office in the city, so it seemed fitting that the TAFE NSW course be delivered there.

The Western Sydney Airport is expected to support almost 28,000 direct and indirect jobs in western Sydney by 2031 and nearly 120,000 in the long term, fostering a need to skill up local residents with job-ready skills through courses like the ones offered at TAFE NSW.

The Statement of Attainment in Professional Computing is perfect for someone entering the workforce for the first time, after a break, or wanting to improve their employability and gain confidence with office software, which are skills required in many workplaces.

- ♥ Get active! This doesn't mean you have to run a marathon. Taking regular short walks can make a big impact to your overall health.
- Get a good night's sleep. Amazing things happen in the brain and body while we're asleep. Sleep boosts our immune system and it allows our bodies to repair.





Camden Town Farm

Looking for somewhere local to visit? How about a trip to Camden Town Farm?

Located in historic Camden, Camden Town Farm was originally a 52 hectare dairy farm that was purchased by the Davies family in 1908. Llewella Davies was the youngest of two children and after her parents death, Llewella inherited the house and farm.

Llewella was an energetic member of the Camden community who worked at the Camden News office for many years. She also volunteered for a number of community organisations including the Red Cross and Camden Historical Society.

On her death in 2000, Llewella Davies left 55 acres of her family's dairy farm to Camden Council so that it could be used by the community. It was Llewella's wish that the land be used as a functional model farm for educational purposes and that the community have access to it for recreation.

To honour the legacy left to the community, a memorial walkway was opened in 2019, known as the "Miss Llewella Davies Pioneers Walkway". The walkway is approximately 2.4 km long and



covers riparian zones, pastoral, grazing and cropping paddocks and it offers fantastic views of St Johns Church, the Chinese Washing Wells, the Nepean River and Macquarie House.

There are three different walking tracks to choose from which allow visitors to experience historic and natural interests within the Town Farm.

Nepean River Link. A 250 metre track with a flat and even surface with no steps or steep sections. Suitable for wheelchair users who have someone to assist

Matahill Creek Loop. A 800 metre track, also with a flat and even surface with no steps or steep sections. Suitable for wheelchair users who have someone to assist

Elizabeth Street Farm Link. A 1.3 kilometre track with short steep hill sections and rough surfaces. This track is not wheelchair accessible.

The walkway is open daily during daylight hours. Visitors are asked to observe signage and follow directions. Note there is no drinking water on the pathway so take your own. Visitors are also asked to take all their rubbish with them.

Please note that as this is an operational farm, dogs are not permitted. Parking is available at each end of Exeter St either near the Onlsow Park entry or near Elizabeth St.
