ORAN PARK TOWN NEWS

Development Update

Julia Reserve - most of the concrete walls to the four bio-retention basins have been completed. Blockwork and Julia Creek basin works are progressing well and pedestrian



bridges are currently being manufactured.

Landscaping works to the western half of Julia Reserve is expected to start soon. This will include construction of the skate park and parkour zones. The balance of the landscaping works will follow after the civil works have been completed.

Youth & Recreation Centre - site establishment and set-out has been finished. Construction documentation and drawings have been completed and off-site manufacturing has started.

Detailed excavations and piling activities will start early June.

Parks

Doohan Reserve - bulk earthworks are now complete and you can now begin to get a better appreciation of the scale of the facility being delivered. Landscaping to the area will commence shortly.

Anthony Creek – Civil Works - all authority approvals for Anthony Creek have been secured by the team and TRN has commenced works on site.

The installation of sediment control measures are underway as well as shaping of the bio-retention basins. Rocks have been delivered to the site and will be installed upon completion of earthworks.

Roads

The traffic signals at the intersection of Dick Johnson Drive and South Circuit are now operational and the section of Dick Johnson Drive between Steward Drive and South Circuit, near the school, is now open to the public. The connection of Dick Johnson Drive to The Northern Road is expected to be complete early in the new year, however this is dependent on the RMS works currently underway on The Northern Road.







Traffic signals are currently being installed on Oran Park Drive at Dick Johnson Drive and Podium Way. The signals at Podium Way are expected to be operational by the end of June and signals at Dick Johnson Drive will come online once the section of Dick Johnson Drive between Brabham Reserve and Oran Park Drive opens.

We recognise the importance of providing an additional entry/exit to Oran Park particularly for residents living in the south east corner of the development (near the Oran Park Town sign) and we've been pursuing approval of the intersection at Banfield Drive and Harrington Parkway for the past two and half years. Work has now commenced at this intersection and is expected to be complete early/mid 2020. The team is working closely with the contractor to ensure minimal disruption whilst these works are carried out.

We have been coordinating with the adjoining developer for the opening of Hollows Drive off Banfield Drive which will allow residents to exit via Catherine Park Drive. We have completed works on our side and the adjoining developer still has some work to do. We expect the road will open late this year.

Construction is underway on the Peter Brock Drive bridge which crosses South Creek. Peter Brock Drive will ultimately connect to Springfield Road and Catherine Fields with work expected to be completed mid 2020.

Construction Update

Momento Hospitality, the operators of Bella Vista Hotel, have lodged a development application for a tavern which will be located to the north of the town centre. The tavern will include a rooftop cocktail lounge, beer garden, restaurant and bistro as well as two cinemas and function rooms.

Construction continues on the Commercial Building opposite the Podium, with formwork almost complete to the ground floor. Due to significant interest in the commercial building, a development application has been lodged for a second commercial building which will sit adjacent to the building currently under construction.

Anglicare Expansion

Anglicare have commenced work on a new residential aged care home which will be built alongside the Anglicare Oran Park Village in Grice Street.

The \$31M project will include an 80 bed aged care home with a 16 bed dementia wing. This new facility will provide a home for older people in need of support and will employ about 80 people in roles such as nurses, occupational therapists and other care related staff.

In addition, the village will grow further with 67 new two and three bedroom retirement living villas.

The village is pet-friendly and residents can stay healthy, active and social with the onsite gym, indoor pool, outdoor bowling green, resident workshop and community lounge. The village has the









added benefit of being close to shops and public transport.

The first stage of development is expected to be completed in 2021.
