It's important for women of all ages to know what they can do to help find breast cancer early. Finding breast cancer early means there are more treatment options and the chances of survival are greatest.

Mammograms can detect cancers the size of a grain of rice, long before they can be seen or felt by you or your doctor, but it's also important for women to be breast aware even if you're having regular mammograms.

You don't need to be an expert or use a special technique to check your breasts. Take the time to get to know the normal look and feel of your breasts as part of everyday activities. Knowing

what is normal for you will help you to detect any new breast or nipple changes.

ORAN PARK TOWN NEWS

Development Update

Julia Reserve - Civil works will be completed this week which will allow the landscaping contractor access to the eastern half of the site.

Landscaping works to the western half of the site is on program. In-ground and hard landscaping services elements such as footpaths, structural walls and street furniture have been installed. Landscaping works in the parkour and skate park is progressing well with the skate bowl profiles and skate structural walls completed. Installation of the arbour structure has started and a public art community workshop is planned to finalise some of the artwork designs.

The focus for the next few weeks is to complete the open space and soft landscaping elements and to progress with the parkour, skate park and arbour structure installation. Landscaping of the western end of the site will also commence.

Youth & Recreation Centre - All steel frames have been completed and erected on site with roof sheeting currently being installed.

Hutchinson are progressively working through the internal spaces completing light steel framing and roughing in of services to commence within the next few weeks.

Likewise external cladding is underway with face brickwork complete and light weight cladding scheduled to be completed by the end of October.

Podium Stage Two - the design phase continues with the team busily preparing construction certificate plans





in anticipation of receiving development approval at the end of this year.

Commercial Building — the commercial building located opposite the Podium now stands to its full height with the last section of the roof deck being installed in early October. Scaffolding will gradually be removed and installation of glass panelling has commenced transforming the look to more of a finished building. Completion date is expected to be February 2020.

Parks

Rons Creek / Splash Park - a milestone has been achieved with the splash park slabs now poured, support poles installed for the shade structures and the steel frame of the amenities and pump room buildings erected. Construction has also commenced on the roads surrounding Rons Creek Park which will provide access and parking to the splash park facilities.

Julia Creek – development approval has been received for a pedestrian link from Dick Johnson Drive at the rear of Oran Park Primary School to Podium Way. Construction Certificate plans



have now been lodged with Council and we are awaiting approval.

This section of Julia Creek will provide an important pedestrian link from Oran Park Town to Sir Jack Brabham Reserve. The pedestrian link will also connect the Public Primary School and Oran Park High School to Sir Jack Brabham Reserve with direct access under Dick Johnson Drive without the need to cross a major road. This link completes the north south pedestrian

connection to the Julia Reserve Youth Park, Youth and Recreation Building and the town centre.

Street Trees are one of our Town's most important assets. They provide shade for pedestrians, improve the appearance of our streets and provide environmental benefits. Tree lined street also increase property values and improve the overall health of our communities.

Along with Council, the Oran Park Town team are committed to greening up our streets and regularly participate with Council's street tree replacement program. You may see street tree replacement being undertaken from time to time where missing or damaged trees are to be replaced.

The tree replacement works includes a landscape contractor re-setting out missing trees, tree pit excavation, planting new tree, reparation of timber edge and topsoil and mulch replacement. Trees to be replanted are selected using a common theme used in Oran Park Town. Affected residents will be provided with notification prior to any works being carried out.





We encourage residents to supplement our watering program by providing street trees with a bucket or two of additional water during the drier months. This will help establish the root system and ensure success of the new tree.

Roads

Harrington Parkway & Oran Park Drive intersection - Works to date have been contained to the verge and footpath areas with service adjustments and road works in preparation for the future Banfield Drive connection.

Construction will now commence in early October on the Oran Park Drive carriageway in preparation for the new four-way signalised intersection. We expect there will be some delays and changes to traffic movements on Oran Park Drive for the construction period, however traffic management will be in place throughout the duration of works to keep disruption to a minimum. Work is expected to be completed in March 2020 and once complete, the new intersection will provide a much-needed additional connection onto Oran Park Drive for Oran Park residents.

Dick Johnson Drive – sections of Dick Johnson Drive near Sir Jack Brabham Reserve and to the east of Oran Park Drive are nearing completion. Once these sections of Dick Johnson Drive are complete, the road will provide a major connection from Madden Street to Steward Drive. Once the RMS complete works on The Northern Road, we will complete the missing section of Dick Johnson Drive, providing another important connection for residents living in the north-west section of Oran Park Town.

Peter Brock Drive connection to Springfield Road – the bridge at the end of Peter Brock Drive over South Creek is taking shape with the pedestrian bridges now installed.

Development approval has now been received for the light vehicle road connection to Springfield Road and we now await construction certificate approvals in order to commence work. The road over South Creek is due to open early next year and the connection to Springfield Road is expected to be completed by mid-2020.

Crime Prevention Message

Stealing from vehicles is a high volume crime in NSW.

The most commonly stolen items are number plates, cash, wallets (including bank cards and licences) and GPS devices and spare change left in plain sight.

Having personal items stolen from your car is inconvenient, distressing and can be expensive. You face the cost of replacing the stolen items as well as repairing damaged windows or locks.

Follow the tips below to see how you can reduce your likelihood of having your valuables stolen from your vehicle.

Don't keep valuables and personal items in your car.

Don't leave anything that might be tempting to thieves.

Make sure all windows are closed and doors are locked, even when your car is parked at home.

Keep all valuables out of sight. If you choose to leave valuables such as phones, laptops, etc, turn them off and lock them in the boot.

Leave nothing in plain sight that may make your car interesting to a thief. Never leave tools unsecured.

If you park in a garage, make sure you lock it.

Keep your keys secure.

Do not leave bank statements, bills or other personal documentation in your car. They can be used by a thief to steal your identity.

Install an alarm and use it.

Remember if you see or hear something, report it to Police.
