



Get Set to Explore

Open Space

New Baseball Facility (near Barramurra Public School)
Following a tender process we have now appointed a civil contractor to construct the car park and services.
A builder has also been appointed to construct the amenities building. The civil works are underway and the builder will start the first week of March.

We are currently out to tender for the landscape component, being the baseball field and landscaping. Landscaping works will commence mid year.

Stage 1 of the facility includes a full-size competition baseball field, amenities building and car park. Completion is expected end of 2024.

Other Developments

We will soon be going to tender for the construction of the 184 room Hotel. We expect to start construction mid to late 2024.

Metro Central apartments

Construction continues with internal fit-out being well underway on the 66 apartment residential building.

Completion is expected in April with residents moving in soon after.

Residential 3

We will be going out to tender shortly for construction of the two buildings which will deliver 177 apartments. Construction is expected to commence late 2024.



LPC House

It's been a hive of activity at LPC House as businesses continue their fit-outs.

Little Duck Café has opened since our last update and Good Feeling Thai is set to open soon. Both the café and Thai restaurant are located on the ground floor of LPC House.

Later in the year, Stage 2 is planned to open, including the Upper Levels featuring expansive Function Space, Boutique Cinemas and the much-anticipated Jinja Rooftop Bar.



Community Pantry now in Oran Park


It doesn't take much for your weekly grocery shop to add up and that can put all sorts of pressure on other areas of your weekly budget.

New Urgent Care Service

The Camden community now has greater access to advice and treatment for their urgent healthcare needs without having to wait at a busy hospital emergency department.

A NSW Government-funded **Urgent Care Service (UCS)** recently opened at Gregory Hills, providing one-off care for urgent healthcare needs which are not life-threatening.

Gregory Hills UCS is a collaboration between NSW Health and South Western Sydney Primary Health Network (SWSPHN). It is one of three Urgent Care Services in South Western Sydney, with others located at Liverpool and Bankstown.

The service complements the role of GPs by providing short-term care while also relieving pressure on emergency departments.

Urgent Care Services can treat minor illnesses like gastrointestinal illness or urinary tract infections; minor injuries like closed fractures or simple cuts; and procedures like stitches, drainage of abscesses and basic fracture management.

The new service is open seven days a week (including public holidays) from 8am to 8pm and treatment is free for all Medicare eligible card holders.

To access the service, call Healthdirect anytime on 1800 022 222. Callers speak with a registered nurse who asks a series of questions about their condition and then guides them to the care they need (for interpreter services, call TIS on 131 450 and ask for Healthdirect).

STAR4kids provides free psychological therapies to children aged 3-12 years with, or at risk of, developing a mild to moderate mental illness, including depression, anxiety or stress disorders.

The STAR4kids program consists of up to 12 hours of free psychological support with a mental health professional (psychologist, mental health nurse or accredited social worker) who has experience working with children.



Support navigating the aged care system



For older Australians, understanding and accessing aged care services through My Aged Care and other community supports can be daunting.

In South West Sydney, care finders offers face-to-face support to older people needing help which is not available through the My Aged Care call service or website

There are care finder services available across South Western Sydney and cover a range of cultural needs.

The care finder tasks can include:

 Assist eligible older people with their My Aged Care applications, provide guidance on services to apply for and attend the My Aged Care assessment where appropriate

- Work through income/ means testing and costs (with support from Services Australia as required)
- Help people connect with health services, mental health services, housing services, drug and alcohol services, community groups and transport as needed
- Complete high-level check-in on a periodic basis and follow up support once services have commenced
- Build a rapport with clients and providers

The campaign includes outreach activities, distribution of goodies, a "guide to supporting others" and a robust digital campaign.


