Australian Rugby League legend Royce Simmons was arguably the favourite all-time player of most Penrith Panthers fans where he played over 400 games - 237 as a player for 12 seasons from 1980 to 1991 and 187 games as coach from 1994 to 2001.

In 2021 Royce was diagnosed with dementia and the tough-as-nails former Panthers skipper tackled his diagnosis just as he would any other opponent on the footy field – head on.

He immediately set about not only exploring what he required to do to slow the condition's progress, but his thoughts turned to assisting others who were affected by the disease.

Within months, The Royce Simmons Foundation was created and Royce's Big Walk was launched, a fundraising event aimed at supporting dementia research. This year Royce's Big
Walk event will run for ten
days from 6 August to
15 August, and will cover
300 kilometres with the
itinerary taking in various
destinations across Greater
Sydney, including Taronga
Zoo, Bondi Beach and our
very own Jack Brabham
Reserve in Oran Park!

NewLife Anglican Church.


Activities include Yard games, Hamster Ball, Games 2 U Gaming Van and 6-hole course of Mini Golf.

Oran Park Leisure Centre

Internal works are now largely complete on the multi-purpose courts and pool areas. Remaining works include fitting out the gym and completion of the café fitout and exterior landscaping.

Residential 3

We are about to go out to tender for the construction of the 177 apartment building complex.
Construction is expected to commence late 2024.

In the meantime, extension of Dairy Street is underway.

Open Space

New Baseball Facility (near Barramurra Public School) TRN Group, the appointed civil contractors, have completed kerb and guttering in the car park and preparations are underway for the final layer of pavement.

Sheeth, the building contractors, have brought the amenities building to lock-up stage with completion expected in September.

Glasscotts, the landscaping contractors, have commenced field fencing works and will continue with landscape works over the next few months to include share paths and field regrading.

The facility will be completed in time for use in January 2025 subject to the turf being established.

Development Update

Post Office is coming to Oran Park! We look forward to the Post Office opening up at the Podium later in the year.

In the meantime, the Australia Post Red Box has re-opened in its new location along Podium Way.

Atura Hotel

The Atura Hotel is a landmark 6 storey development comprising of 184 hotel rooms, function and meeting rooms, restaurant and café, outdoor pool and ground floor retail.

Infinity has been appointed as the building contractor. We are working with Infinity on final details for construction and we expect to commence construction by the end of the year.

Development Updates (cont.)

LPC House

The six storey commercial building is 70% sold and leased.

Businesses will continue to open over the coming months as fitouts are completed.

Employment Zone

Works are well progressed on the KFC site with fitout expected to commence in August and the business anticipated to open late September 2024.

Works are also progressing well on the EG site with the builder commencing installation of services.

Fitout works are expected to commence in the last quarter and the service station is expected to open later this year.

We are excited to announce that an Ambulance Station is to be built in Oran Park!

Health has been a priority area for the development team and we have actively been advocating for and looking for opportunities to fulfill our goal.

Early in 2023, the state government put out an EOI for a new ambulance station site in the vicinity of Narellan and we took the opportunity to put in a submission which nominated three potential sites in Oran Park.

Following a comprehensive evaluation process we were delighted to have one of those sites nominated as the future home for a new Ambulance Station.

The Ambulance Station will be located near the Oran Park Fire Station. The site provides good access to The Northern Road which will optimise emergency ambulance responses across South Western Sydney, while meeting the future health needs of the community.

In other exciting news, we are proposing to build a film and TV studio in the Employment Zone and we are currently working with architects and producers to come up with a design. We intend to lodge a DA with Council in the next few months and once approved we will go out to tender and, subject to feasibility, we will move forward with construction.

Join Local Health Forum in Campbelltown to give valuable feedback on planning for a good death

Macarthur community members, service providers and healthcare providers are invited to give valuable feedback on end-of-life care planning at South Western Sydney PHN's (SWSPHN) Local Health Forum in Campbelltown on Thursday, 5 September.

Local Health Forums run twice a year at venues across the region. Each forum has a different discussion topic. The focus of the upcoming Local Health Forum is end-of-life care planning.

In Australia, up to 360 people die every day who could benefit from palliative care. Advance care planning helps ensure your loved ones and health providers know what matters most to you and respect your treatment wishes.

SWSPHN wants a greater understanding of the barriers which prevent palliative care services from being utilised by more people in South Western Sydney. They want to ensure more people implement an advance care plan so their end-of-life wishes are known.

The Macarthur Local Health Forum will be held at Rydges Campbelltown, from 6.30pm to 9pm. Forums will also be held in Bass Hill and Bowral.

- Set bin reminders for waste collections

Protect your vacant block from illegal dumping

Owners are urged to fence their vacant blocks to stop asbestos and other waste being dumped on their property.

Illegal dumpers target isolated vacant blocks with few neighbours, where they can dump unnoticed. A lack of neighbours in new housing release areas also means

there are no witnesses, making it difficult to trace and punish the dumper.

If dumpers can be identified, on-the-spot fines for small-scale illegal dumping start from \$7,500 for individuals to \$15,000 for corporations while court-imposed penalties can be up to \$250,000 for an individual

and up to \$1 million for corporations – let alone the clean-up costs.

If illegal dumpers cannot be identified, the landowner is stuck with an often expensive clean up.

Illegal dumping is a serious environmental crime.
Protect your property.

Deter illegal dumping by fencing your vacant land.



This Spring get rid of your clutter and clean out your gutter

When it comes to spring cleaning, keep you and your family safe from fire by:

- Clearing up any unnecessary clutter to ensure easy access to and from each room.
- Correctly dispose of any old or damaged equipment that could pose a fire threat
- Safely clean out your gutters of any leaves and debris in preparation for the warmer months ahead.
- Roll, don't fold electric blankets when putting into storage. Folding can damage the wiring.

- Check the hose and connections on any LPG-fuelled barbecues before use.
- Dispose of barbecue coals correctly
- Make sure you have a working smoke alarm and test monthly.
- If a fire does occur, get out, stay out and call Triple Zero (000)
- Household chemicals and old household batteries can be disposed of at local Community Recycling Centres.



Kitchen Fire Safety

Did you know that almost half of all residential fires start in the kitchen? It's a sobering statistic, but with the right precautions, you can significantly reduce the risk.

Fire and Rescue NSW is asking the community to familiarise and follow these essential kitchen fire safety tips:



- Keep children away from cooking areas and consider installing stove guards.
- Heat cooking oil slowly in the right-sized saucepan to avoid splatters.
- Turn pot and pan handles inwards to prevent accidental knocks.
- Regularly clean stove grills, range hood filters, and kitchen appliances.
- Install a fire extinguisher and blanket, located at least one meter from the stove.
- Use non-slip mats around the stove and sink area.
- If a fire occurs, switch off the appliance, leave, and call 000 from a safe place.

Practice these precautions to ensure a safe and secure kitchen environment for you and your family.
